 Muecht on Saturday. There is also some hopes
 of the French being drove back which will make
 the Coast clear. This last year I wish Sincerely
 & hope to have it confirmed. The Duke & the
 Princess Caroline have both wrote to the King
 are very much satisfied with G^d Malmebury's
 Conduct, & seem all in good Spirits.

I hope by this Time You have made Y^r Mind
 easy about many Y^r Seafaring People, it is what I do

Pray hurry
 up, every

anxious by wish for Y^r sake, as I know nothing so
 plaguing in life as an unexplained conduct.

Your expressions about me, are very flattering
 that I do assure you that I feel them very sensibly
 I never has & ever shall be my study to deserve
 Y^r good opinion, & if by any exertion of mine I may
 at this present moment extricate you out of Y^r
 difficulties, & procure you what you wish to have,
 my Inclination would lead me to do it Unasked.
