I take the Liberty of sending You a Receipt for

& we have had it baked with great success at Windsor. The
K^y also has given Orders to the Duke of Dorset to
have no other Bread served to the Household & even
to His own Table, than Brown Bread: & it is to be hoped
that this will encourage others to do the same.

As now I take my leave for the K^y is come home &
breakfast upon the Table, there I will drink Y^r Health
in a strong Dish of Coffe after having subscribed myself
the 16th July
1795.
