I forgot to mention Yesterday, that it is likely the Princess may by to Day or to Morrow feel Uneasy & appear less well on account of the Milt, that is in itself a common Circumstance, ~~which~~ but may be attended with Fever, I hope she will be kept very quiet until it runs freely, as it is apt to make People very Nervous & low.

& Now I come to the dear little Object but my heart loves my little Grand Daughter, I hope she goes on thrivingly, my accounts of her Beauty makes

every body Curious to see Her. I trust She will be
a Pleasant Sight all Her Life: both to You &
Us. After this Day is past I would recommend
to Yourself a little ease, so much anxiety as
as You have gone through for these two Days de-
mands a little quiet, Pray tell me You are well
