 You & to Her Family in good Health & to prolong
 Her Life. You will be pleas'd to let Miss Goldsworthy
 have every possible information from Lady Dashwood
 about what is, & is not to be done I will answer for
 Her fulfilling it, & As I have never found ^{Her} Tracypsin
 ever since I know Her, I hope every Body's Mind will
 be easy upon that Subject.
