Day. I have such good ^{accounts} from Amelia
of Herself that I do not fear the journey
& look anxiously for Next Wednesday to
see Her. The dear little Girl ^{partly}
behaved like an Angel on Thursday, she
delighted the King with singing Hearts of Oak
as also with Her reluctance of leaving His.

The Weather seems to be well looking as
the Sun Shines, but I am told it is very
Damp, & therefore I hope You will not
venture out to soon, as repelling the
Complaint, whatever it may be, might
be a very dangerous thing, at least I
would not advise you to stir without the
approbation of a Surgeon, You may say
say I preach Nonsense, but believe me
it is the Effect of sincere anxiety from
