My dearest Son. I am to return You thanks
for the Letter you sent me from Augustus
& the Book from Vienna, which arrived safely
yesterday morning. I am sorry that poor Augustus
has been so nowell ever since His Physician
left him as I fear that he will not meet
with another that can know His Constitution
equal to Domeyer. He had doubtless good rea-
sons for parting with him, but I fear he
will feel his loss severely.

I have the pleasure to inform You that
Charlotte goes on better & better every day
even Yeate assures me that her little neck
& backbone grow considerably better, Lady
Elgin has been seriously ill indeed, she begins
to mend, but it will be slow. There is no danger

at present, Her attack was Bilious & money
it by herself, but timely assistance has done
so well that she can now see the child who
by the by was wretched to a degree.

I am glad to hear you have met with
some success at the races. & that at last the
weather proves to be fine. I trust it will con-
