My Dearest Son. The kind manner in which You are pleased to ask my advice concerning a Summer Residence for dear little Charlotte, induced me to communicate the contents of Your Letter to the King as the best means of doing Justice to Your wishes. The King after giving the Subject a most mature Consideration is of opinion, that as all unpleasant matters are past, & quiet restored, it will be far better for You to secure a House near the Sea Side for Your Daughter, as Her coming to Windsor might perhaps be the means of creating some unforeseen uneasiness which He is sure You as well as Himself would equally wish to avoid.

I should have acknowledged the Receipt of Your Letter Yesterday, had I not thought that You would be better at once to receive an answer which would prevent Your delaying to secure

a retired Place near the Sea Side as the Season is
fast advancing.
