My dearest Son. The inclosed is the Paper  
which I received at six a Clock this Eve-  
ning from the Council, which was ~~followed~~  
<sup>arrival of the</sup> by the three Consulting Physicians about  
a quarter of an Hour afterwards very  
unexpectedly: - They were not allowed  
to see the King until the attending Phy-  
sicians <sup>could</sup> all be present which was  
just at the Time when the King was  
to Bed: & after that Visit they went  
to the Inn where they are to Lodge  
I believe no Conversation took place this  
Evening between the two parties.  
If I had known that You had not  
been informed of the Decision of the Council

I should have sent it by the return of  
the messenger. it was Mr Henry Halford  
who told me You were ignorant of what  
had passed.

I beg pardon for sending such a bad  
piece of writing, but it is late & I  
am afraid not to be in time for  
the Duke of Cambridge who is the bearer  
of this. I wish You a very good  
nights rest or if You please - a short  
repros. & though half a Sleep most

Her Majesty having been graciously pleased to procure that Dr Grano Dr Simmons & Dr Willis should conjointly have access at stated periods to the King's apartment in order that they may be enabled by their personal observation of His Majesty's habit, demeanour, & condition both of Body & Mind, to form an accurate judgement of the extent & nature of the disorder, to make their reports to the Council & to advise whether any & what alteration of treatment is likely to produce any beneficial change in His Majesty's state, Her Majesty nevertheless objecting to their interference during their access, in the management of the King & insisting upon Dr M. Willis's still retaining that management, & objecting to their making themselves known to the King, & requiring that they should be considered as consulting physicians & that they should not sign the resolutions, The Members of Her Majesty's Council now assembled do therefore resolve

Dr Innes Dr Simmons & Dr Willis to repair to Windsor as immediately as may be to the intent of conjointly having access to His Majesty, for the purposes before mentioned at such stated periods as may be agreed upon between them & the Physician already in attendance upon His Majesty, having regard to what Her Majesty was before mentioned hath objected to, & insisted upon.

Copy of the Queen's answer
