My dearest Son, I am sorry to learn by
Sr Henry Stalford's Letter to Augusta, that
You are threatened with a very long Confinement
to your Couch I wish most sincerely
that You may have Patience to bear up
under such a severe Calamity for without doubt
it is the only Remedy that can recover
such an accident but requires much Fortitude.

With infinite pleasure do I hear that
the Violence of the Pain is abated, & flatter
myself that to Days account may bring
us the good news of Yr being quite free
of all unpleasant feels.

The Duke of York promised to relate what
had passed between the Council & me Yesterday,
it really was so little that it was

not worth while
troubling You with a Letter about it.
John Willis is not arrived nor do I think
He can reach this Place till to Morrow
or Tuesday when He arrives I shall
let You know—

Having nothing to entertain You with,
It is better not to trouble You any
longer with my Servant but to assure
You how Sincerely I am
