berlains Direction either ~~Lord~~ Harford or ~~Lord~~ John-
son should attend the Procession, & also if possible
Count Münster as the Family Minister. all
those that belong to the Establishment here
will be at the Church door to receive the Body
as a Respect due to the King ~~which~~ & attention
which could be given it he would be highly pleased
with.

I am glad to hear that the meeting at Blackheath
is gone off so well, as also to learn that this
Act of Yours has given universal Satisfaction

in the World. I hope this will stop all further
Proceedings tho' I will own I always live in
Terror of something else. but provided if what
ever may arise does but come unprovided I feel
courageous that all will go well.

Sophia is better to day which gives me
great comfort to inform you of. The day is
so fine that we are all a going out & I hope
you may enjoy the Fresh Air in yr pretty
