I am glad to hear that the meeting at Blackheath is gone off so well, as also to learn that this Act of Yours has given universal Satisfaction

in the World. I hope this will stop all further  
Proceedings tho I will own I always live in  
Terror of something new. but provided if what  
ever may arise does but come unprovoked I feel  
courageous that all will go well.
