My dearest Son. Since I had the pleasure of seeing You on Sunday last, I have ~~been~~ occupied my thoughts upon Y^r Kindness towards my Brothers & particularly upon the Idea of Brother Ernests coming with L^{ieut}. T. I. to England & of Your Intention to make him an Inhabitant of Y^r House when in London. No Body can be more truly Sensible or feel more deeply Your attention, and I will add that the Idea ^{only} of seeing again one of those Relations so long parted from, ^{we} creates a pleasure in my feelings which my Pen is very unable to express: but before this kind Intention is put into execution You will excuse me for making some remarks which I am sure You will see the Necessity of considering.

I feel it my Duty to state that My youngest Brothers income being extremely small in Germany it will necessarily become still smaller when that little is exchanged

in this Country & that since the Distresses in Germany
 I believe His whole income consists chiefly of the
 Pension granted by the King, ^{which tho' nobler} will not be competent
 to support Him here, & the Duke tho' comparatively
 better off than Him, can not assist Him, & as to myself
 under present circumstances my expences being necessa-
 rily greater than they were before the Kings Illness,
 puts it out of my Power to do what my Heart
 would dictate for Him. I would not have troubled You
 with this if I did not know by experience that it
 is better to consider before hand than to find difficulties
 arise afterwards.

Another thing I think it right to name is in case
 You should still be of opinion that my Nephew
 should accompany my Brother, I fear that the Duke
 would feel reluctant to part with both at once
 & in that case perhaps if they were to alternate their
