sober this Morning with joy I feel capa-
ble of returning You thanks for the great
News You sent Us last Night, may I soon
be enabled to congratulate You upon the
Parisians having declared for the Bourbons
for I look upon that Event as the greatest
Recompence England can obtain for its
Honourable, Steady & invariable Upright
Conduct, & I most sincerely partake of Your
Pleasure upon this Occasion for as it has
pleased Providence to deprive the King of the
Happiness He would have experienced
now, that it is fallen to Your Share to
have followed up his exertions & to see them
Succeed.

I will not Name the Gout taking it for
Granted that the Entrance of the Allies
into Paris have calmed ~~the~~ the last six
weeks Constant Agitation, & I do not doubt
that the receiving the Comte de Lisle a
reinstated King of France will inter
restore your Health to the joy of
my dearest Son
