The Queen considers it to be Her Duty to
lose no time in acquainting the Prince of Wales that she
has received a communication from Her Son, the Prince
Regent, in which he states that, Her Majesty's Intention of
holding Two Drawing Rooms in the ensuing Month
having been notified to the Public, he must declare
that he considers that his own Presence at Her Court
cannot be dispensed with, and that he desires it may
be distinctly understood, for Reasons of which he alone
can be the Judge, to be his fixed and unalterable
Determination not to meet the Prince of Wales
upon any Occasion, either Public or Private.

The Queen is thus placed under
the

'the painful necessity of intimating to the Prince
of Wales the Impossibility of Her Majesty's recovery
Her Royal Highness at Her Drawing Rooms.
