as I am unfit to Exercise a Regiment of Dragoons

You must therefore be so kind as to think
of some other Person to relieve Col^l Garth, which
perhaps might be found among some of your own
attendants or Friends— but should You by chance
be under Difficulty to meet with any body so
immediately— Col^l Garth was some time ago of
opinion that Col^l Addenbrooke would be very fit
to undertake it and ~~unfitly~~ to be trusted as a Person to
obey and adhere strictly to any orders He should receive.

I beg to observe that I have no Personal acquaintance with Him, but His Character must be known by many and even Yourself must have seen him often at the late Sr William Pitt's who was His great Friend and I know Him to have retained the good opinion of all the ^{honour} ~~the~~ ~~recommends~~ ~~them~~ ~~to~~ ~~me~~.

I will not any longer detain You ~~and~~ being sure that any orders You have to give, will of course be given to G^o Earle, who will be the best able to report to You by so many Months Observation what kind of Person will be most fit to undertake the Task of succeeding Him - before I finish may I beg one little word in answer to poor Prie to ease His mind easy, and that You will believe me to be troublesome with a Fourth Letter not less Sincerely
