My dearest Son. According to the  
Message You sent <sup>me</sup> on Sunday last by  
Your Sister Mary, I wrote to Lady  
Ilchester Your wishes of giving a  
Meeting to Lady Fielding to communicate  
to Her the Duties required of Her in  
the Situation You have placed Her in  
about Your Daughter as also to Inform  
Charlotte of it - The latter was recei-  
ved with all possible cheerfulness &  
good Humour - But as to the Meeting  
between the two Ladies, Lady Ilchester  
observes, that as You had permitted  
Charlotte previous to Her leaving  
London to retain Lady Goslin at Weymouth,

untill Her return to Cranburn Lodge  
by Fieldings being there also must  
prove Inconvenient particularly as  
by Hoplin has made all Her arrange-  
ments accordingly & as the Distances  
well as the Expence from Shropshire  
is very considerable by Mchester  
wishes to know if You would allow  
Her to write to by Fielding to give  
Her a ready Voas in London at Her  
return of which She will give Her  
the earliest Information.
