a very good Night. I feel reasonable
enough to begin the Morning with
returning You Thanks for all Your
Kindness & attention during my stay
at Brighton as also for the most plea-
sing & agreeable Party I met there.

I was greatly distressed before I set
out upon my Journey about the accounts
of Charlotte, but by a Letter which arrived
this Morning I have indeed every reason
to believe that there can not be the least
difficulty of Her returning to Cranburn
Lodge Time sufficient for Her to accompany
me on the 6th next Month. I have sent
off Mr Baillie, & desired Him to follow

His Natural Disposition of Speaking
Truth to the Drs & also to those about
Her.

I have taken the Liberty of sending
You a Visitor that is to say Dr H. Hallon
as I have a much greater opinion of His
Medical Knowledge than of Yours, I hope
He will prescribe something to remove
those obstructions in the Stomach with
less Laudanum & if by this I have committ
an Error it arises not from the Head
but from the Heart of
