Servants for the Time, I answer for the Cleaning,

& neatness of the Place as also for the
Pleasure it will give Her to accomodate
any Branch of the Royal Family.

I have just received a Letter from
the Prince of Lebourg ~~was~~ expressing a
wish to come to Windsor early next
week, I have therefore in my answer
Invited Him for the ~~22^d~~^{22^d} next Monday
& do not doubt to Amuse Him tolerably
well if the weather continues as Fine as
it is to Day - With Your leave I shall
also Invite Lord ~~Minster~~^{Minster} to meet Him
& I do not fear but we shall do very well.
