The House tho' not large is convenient, & the place notwithstanding its retired situation very pleasfull, some parts of the ground very pretty & professed according to Mr Brown's Expressions some capabilitie of which I am sure they will take advantage in time as both seem inclined to do so.

The dinner on Tuesday is to be

sounded at Five a Clock & if you
will be there by Seven it will give
you time to see the House of Commons.
I name this hour only as perhaps the
most convenient to you, but any hour
or time you choose to be there they
opened & would be agreeable to them.

I hope that you feel no longer
any inconvenience of either the Heat or
the Cold I did hear you complained of
a bay you to believe & I unfeebly
