Law may for once prove more than
Insanity against the Perpetrators for
this is the Third attempt against a Sovereigns
life Since I am in England & unless some

present disposition of the Mobility much
Mischief may arise. For the Nation itself
is a Generous & Liberal Nation - If You
act right & do yr Duty as You have
done hitherto I am sure You have nothing
to fear & My Prayer will be added to
that of Thousands for Your Preservation
as a Blessing to the Nation & not less
