Lord George Germain has the honor  
of acquainting your Majesty, that  
he has received the dispatches this  
instant from Sr Henry Clinton and  
Major General Protection from  
New York. Sr Henry now seems  
to be in a situation ~~of~~ which  
gives every reasonable prospect  
of success notwithstanding the delay  
and the loss of some transports, and  
the defiance made of war, though  
fortunately the men are collected.

The detachment preparing for Canada  
may give General Haldimand the  
means of saving Quebec if the French  
should attack it. It seems  
Clinton has great merit in providing  
for that service and he is engaged  
in so different and important an  
operation.
