My Lord,

I since I had the pleasure of seeing Your  
Lordship at ~~Windsor~~ <sup>Yesterday</sup> ~~and the Physicians~~ <sup>and the Physicians</sup>,  
communicated  
to you their opinion ~~of the Physicians~~  
respecting His Majesty's Removal, Doubts  
have arisen in my mind of the  
Propriety of immediately adopting their  
sentiments and acting on my own  
authority without a previous communication  
with <sup>all</sup> His Majesty's confidential Servants.  
I therefore have to desire your Lordship  
both for myself and on the Part  
of the Family to fix a meeting of  
the ~~the~~ His Majesty's Cabinet Ministers  
at Windsor tomorrow at two o'clock  
in order that His Majesty's situation  
may be fully & formally <sup>expressed</sup> ~~expressed~~ <sup>by them</sup>  
provisionally to any <sup>whatsoever</sup> ~~measure~~ <sup>being</sup> adopted

I shall direct the Physicians and  
all other Persons who have been  
in attendance on his Majesty  
to be in readiness to give every  
~~such~~ <sup>possible</sup> information to the Council.
