Dear Sir

May I beg you to inform H: R: H: that I have written to the D: of Portland to inform him that I am perfectly satisfied with the intended arrangement, as I shall ever be with whatever is thought advisable by my great Protector.

I intend also to call on L^d Fitzwilliam & say every thing to him that is proper upon this occasion.

In my letter to the Duke of Portland I have entered ~~a little~~ ~~some~~ something at large into L^d Hinchingbrooks case,

it would be troublesome to you if I was to
recapitulate what I have there said, but
I think I have used some arguments that
will make an impression; & if H. K. H.
would throw in a few words in favour
of them, I think I should carry my point.
The hurt of this is, that if he loses his
employment, he and his family will be
distressed beyond measure, and it will
throw some very unpleasant obstacles
in my way of managing the county in
the manner I could wish to do.

I also mentioned the Lieutenancy of the
County, which surely ought to be put
into my hands as soon as possible: I
am told that addresses ^{in favour of Pitt} will be attempted
every where ~~that~~ where impression can
be made; & in the divided state of
Huntingdownshire the appearance at the
public meetings of an active Lord
Lieutenant who is used to business of
