Lord Carmarthen begs leave to inform  
your Royal Highness, that the Marquis del Campo  
has consummated the formal notification of the  
late King of Spain's Death, & has also delivered  
his own Credentials as Ambassador from the  
present King of Spain.

Lord Carmarthen has thought it expedient to  
desire the Lord Chamberlain to issue orders for  
the Court going into mourning for the late King  
of Spain, the late Infanta, the late Infant  
Don Gabriel her Husband, as likewise for the  
late Margrave of Brandenburg-Schwedt, & the  
Prince of Baden-Doulsach. The Deaths of these several



Personages having been formally announced.

Lord Carmarthen begs leave to remark, that the originals of these papers being directed to His Majesty, have not been opened, but that the copies of them appeared sufficiently to justify Lord Carmarthen in troubling your Royal Highness on the subject of their respective contents.
