Madam,

Supposing it was Your M^{ty}
had nothing particular to say to the King
& myself arising in private owing to ^{my} ^{ventures} ^{to} ^{be} ⁱⁿ ^{the} ^{King's} ^{presence}
continuing in yr. presence. I take not
the liberty having nothing particularly proper
to communicate, to request a private audience
of yr. M^{ty}. Had yr. opportunity permitted
itself, I sh^d. have prepared to have inquired
you from yr. from the urgency of the present
times. I find it incumbent upon me to take
upon myself the administration of H. M^{ty}'s
Hanoverian Territories. I take yr. liberty of

inclosing an authentic Copy of the measures
yt. were necessary to be taken ^{in order} to accomplish
yt. point, & sh. I flatter myself I may venture
to hope, yt. Yr. M^y - will preserve, in order yt
they may be laid before my Father, whenever
