Right Hon^{ble} Lord Chancellor.

My Lords.

I have this instant heard that His Majesty has had a bad fall from his horse, I think it right to acquaint you with the perfect ignorance that I have been kept in relative to this circumstance, which I can not consider in any other light than as perfectly indecent to myself, as well as my Brothers, and but too consonant to the general system that has of late been pursued previous towards us all. The thorough knowledge of your Lordships Sentiments upon this Subject has tempted me to trouble you with this letter
