The Committee proceeded to read His Majesty's
 order, referring to them to enquire, who
 have been the Authors, and Abettors of
 the late Rebellious Tumults &c^a. And then
 thought proper to order the Solicitor of
 the Treasury, to collect and lay before them,
 all the Information he could procure
 relative to the Authors and Abettors, and in
 order thereto to apply to the several Magistrates
 of Middlesex and Surry, of the City of
 London

London and Westminster, and of the Tower
Hamlets, who have acted or been applied to
on the occasion; and likewise to collect
such Evidence as he could procure respecting
the Conduct of the Magistrates within the afore-
mentioned Counties, Cities and Liberties, upon
the Commencement, and during the continuance
of the said Tumults.

Such of the Magistrates as have acted
Ordered to attend when they should be required.

Like Order to the Chief Constables of the
several Divisions, within the aforesaid County &c.

The Keeper of Newgate, Marshall of the
Kings Bench and Warden of the Fleet, with
such of their Officers, as they think likely to
give any Information, to attend when wanted;
as also Keepers of any other Goals, within the
aforementioned County's &c. where Violence
has been used and any prisoners released

Sir John Hawkins Kn^t. & other Justices
of the peace Ordered to attend - as also High
Bailiff of Westminster.

The Recorder and Sheriffs of London
and Middlesex, and also the High Sheriff
of Surrey to attend.

Upon Representation of the want of proper
 places of Confinement in the County of Surrey
 the High Sheriff ordered forthwith to
 provide proper places for the reception &
 safe Custody of Prisoners within the said
 County.

Sheriffs of London and Middlesex to use
 their utmost Endeavours to retake those Felons
 who were confined in Newgate & particularly
 those who lay under Sentence of Death.

Ordered - That His Majesty's Proclamations
 of the 7th and 9th Instant, be read in all
 Churches and Chappels in London & Westminster
 to Morrow Morning, immediately after
 Prayers, and before the Sermon, and the
 Lord Bishop of London desired to give
 Directions accordingly.
