Dear Sir London 30th 1793 —
Bicknell & I saw Gault, who
declared his wish, that our re-
quisition within might be found
practicable, as he thought Gills
case particularly hard; But ex-
-pected his disapprobation of in-
-fringing on the Plans established

us to Garrow, & said if he agreed
to the proposition, he was ready
to consent to afford the relief
