Dear Brother

I see not fit to let Letter return to England without sending you a few lines by them, to tell you what I have explained to them exactly my ideas concerning the Bussuf. It has been employed upon,

As the French appear to be drawing all their forces towards Mainz in order of people to besiege the Sieg, I will speak tomorrow morning, well as many hours as I can in order to strengthen the Cordon or Retire and to break a part off the forces of Cobourg's army which has been

detached for some time. According to the orders which
I have received I have been obliged to part with our
friend Newark and his Brigade, who will march
the day after tomorrow to Blandford and then embark
for the West Indies.
