My dear Lord,

I can not help immediately
acknowledging the receipt of yr. very obliging
Letter of yesterday. May I beg you to let
me, & my most dutiful thanks at this opportunity
but for his gracious condescension & attention
^{in permitting yr. doing this}
towards me, in not taking any further steps
respecting the promotion of Colonels to the rank
of Major General till his Contention ~~or that~~

head were first communicated to me. I should
at any rate have been happy to have received
any promotion in the Army at the hands of His
Majesty, tho' I can not but say that I perfectly
accord with ^{the King's} ~~the King's~~ opinions respecting
as well as with Your Lordship's opinions respecting
the unprofitability of my gradually ascending thro'
the ^{steps} ~~gradations~~ of Major & Lieutenant General
in the ordinary mode of promotion, to the rank
of Full General wh. naturally places me
at the Head of the List of the Army, & I am afft

fairly unsafe, that in the situation affairs are
in a present, (as it is in His Majesty's power
whenever he is pleis'd so to do at any moment
to make me a General with such date to my
commission as he may think proper to affix to it,
& as loss of time can be no object on y^t. account
^{remainders} (me), I had much rather (whilst I am ^{myself} alone
Commandant of this Regiment, until either
this or some other becomes perfectly my own,
wherewithal
to the instant my promotion & compleatment
& information, besides my thorough attachment
to the profession are my principal objects.

But
Before I quit this subject I can not help offering
to you my dear Lord, that I look forward in
anxious hopes that some time hence, my zeal
for the service may so far recommend me to
His Majesty's consideration, as to induce
him to express his gracious approbation of
my conduct by placing me as high, as he
shall deem proper amongst those who have
attained the rank of full General.

I am sorry to have given you so much
trouble respecting the charter of my Regiment
but I desire the interests of my Regiment

so much at heart, that I must trust to your
own feels my dear Lord as a military man
to ~~make~~ ^{reck} my apology acceptable. Allow me
before I conclude to express my thanks to
you for your very great ~~and~~ ^{and} kind attention
to me not only on this, but on every occasion
to assure my dear Lord that I am perfectly
sensible of them. I will not trouble you any
further upon you ^{timey} but conclude close my letter
with desiring you to believe how truly I
