A second Petition has been delivered from the Mother of the Boy Roberts, but as it contains nothing but an Affidavit that one of the Evidences who upon the Tryal said he was a Tobacconist was not so but a Journeyman Saddler, Lord Hillsborough does not give your Majesty the trouble of reading it. Your Majesty will observe that the Recorder will be ready to make his Report on Wednesday, and the Summonses are sent pursuant to your Majesty's Orders. —
