My Dear Sir

I take the earliest opportunity I can of communicating to You, His Majesty's Commands just now received at Greenwich Hospital where I have been waiting with His Majesty's Carriages to have the honor of conducting The Princess Caroline of Brunswick to Town from thence, since three o'clock this day - By a letter which I have had the honor of receiving from His Majesty, dated The Queens House April the 4th ^{at 3} P.M. His Majesty is pleased to inform me that He has received Lord Malmstun's letter brought by Major Hislop, & in consequence has given me His Commands to return to Town this evening with Lady Jenny M^{rs} Astor, Lord Clermont & to return with them & His Carriages tomorrow to Greenwich in time to have the honor of receiving The Princess at Greenwich.

I shall therefore be much obliged to You if You will by the return of the Express, let me know at what

time You calculate, I may expect You at Greenwich tomorrow
which information will possibly be satisfactory to His Majesty
before my departure from Town, & regulate my setting out
from Thence - Excuse haste, I have only time to
congratulate You on your successful Expedition & that
I am anxious to tell You in Person how much I am &
