Lindeman having mispel
this day's Packet, I shall have ample
time between this & Thursday to make up
all my letters, from which I have very
strong hopes of success.

In my life I never met with
such boisterous gentry as those who
are concerned for the Royal Survey
Lane; I trust however they are now

a little lulled, & that your Royal
Highness will bear no more of their
Impertinencies, the Arrangement shall be
very shortly transmitted to you.

I heard yesterday in the City & it
was believed last night, that S. Grenville
was going back directly to Berlin. if this be
true, his Object can be no other than
Peace, as I know that neither the whole
Family of the Grenvilles or the whole Ministry
collected, will ever operate upon the
present King so as to make him join
any Coalition where the House of Austria

gulls the same way. I believe I forgot
to mention to your Royal Highness at
Brighton, that I know for a fact, that
the Dutch Expedition was quizzed by the
King at dinner at Cheshambury the
very day the Hereditary Prince set off for
Lingen, & a good deal of what has since
happened was foretold. I know not why,
but the R. H. the Captain General is not
the best of oddities there - if any thing
occurs your Royal Highness may
rest assured you shall hear of it
directly from your Affee. That
