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Sunday March 1st.

I went to the Queen's Room between the
two hours & by pt. four o'clock, when I came
into the great Dining Room, where were at dinner,
Dr. Gibson & the three Willis. I ask'd how
the King did. Dr John Willis then said "We
are not as well as we were in the morning.
His Majesty is a good deal more irritated,
upon my asking him what particular
causes he attributed this irritation or if it
any, he replied "it might possibly arise from
the effects of the Medicine His Maj. had taken
