two to day on account of Business in
the Common Pleas. In answer to which
L. J. proposed His Dining at St James
Square; which He also declined. Hence
L. J. infers, that He has no wish to
converse on the Subject. L. J. took
His Seat to day; and conversed with
the C. on a Cause depending; but, as the
Subject was not introduced on His Part,
L. J. thought it indiscreet to force it.
