Whereas it appears unto us by the account hereunto annexed and certified by our Trusty and wellbeloved Rear Admiral John Willott Payne our Comptroller General & Auditor General that there is due unto sundry Persons for Provisions and other articles delivered in the quarter ended 5<sup>th</sup> April last, The sum of One Thousand and Seventy Six Pounds Thirteen Shillings and Six pence, our will and Pleasure therefore is that you pay or cause to be paid without Fee or deduction unto Charles Becket our Maître D'Hotel, who shall render account unto the said Rear Admiral John Willott Payne thereof. The said sum of One Thousand and Seventy Six Pounds Thirteen Shillings and Six pence to enable him to discharge the same, and for so doing this together with the acquittance of the said Charles Becket shall be to you a sufficient warrant. Given at Carlton House the Twenty seventh October 1802. in the Forty second year of the Reign of our Royal Father the King.

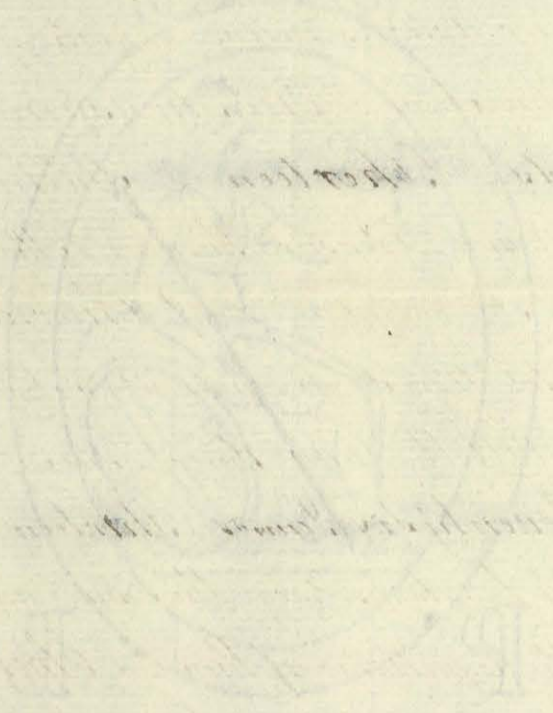
