The King's Ministers
having stated to the Prince
of Wales, that it had been
represented to them, that
the verbal answer to the
questions address'd to His Majesty's
Physicians by the Prince on the
10th of June appear'd to have
been understood by the Prince, in
a sense different from that
which was intended to be convey'd,
and having refer'd the Prince
to the Physicians themselves for
the true meaning of those answers,

The Prince has again call'd
upon the King's Physicians to
attend him, to know from them,
whether the notes, which as
soon as they had left the Room
the Prince set down opposite to
each question as in the inclosed
Paper, ~~did not~~ contain the
substance of their answer¹⁹.

To this question the Prince
desires to have a written answer
sign'd by the Physicians.

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Copy of the Answer of the King's Physicians
given at a Council House July 10th 1684

"We attest that the Answers to the Questions submitted
to us by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales are correct,
as stated on the preceding page, and have only to add
to the answer given to the 3^d Question

"That to the best of our recollection, We answered that
the Controvert was no other than such as might arise in
His Majesty from the Knowledge of the Servants being at
hand, but that Dr. Simmons had assured the Physicians
that there had been no occasion for their interference for some
time past" (Signed)
