Lord North has the honour of sending
his Majesty two Letters of intelligence
from Paris.

The day Lord North left Town, he
had a message from Lord George Gordon
by Lieut. Colonel Woodford, giving him
notice that he should be obliged to call
on Lord North upon his trial to examine him
to certain conversations they had had together
at different times. Mr Woodford was like-
-wise charged by Lord George to inform

Lord North that he thought it necessary
for his cause to publish on or before his
trial the particulars of four conversations
he had had with his Majesty, & to desire
Lord North to apply to His Majesty in
Lord George's name for his permission so
to do. Lord George added that if it had
not been in a case in which his life
was concerned, he should not have
presumed to apply for it. Lord North
has stated the substance of a paper
shown to him by Mr Woodford as well
as he can from memory, but as Mr
