My Dear Mr. Mahon

I have no time, in answering your
letter of yesterday. I remember your
presenting Mr. Paul to His Royal
Highness in the room below stairs.
I never believe his first in service.
I recollect the Prince being much
pleas'd, for some time, wishing to put it
off to a future Day. But His Royal
Highness did see Mr. Paul, beyond
mentioning his Name. The Prince
said He was glad to be made known
to Mr. Paul. The Prince there,
to the best of my recollection,
made some further observation

on Mr Paul's motion respecting His
Friend the Marquis of Wellesley's
conduct, during His Government
in India - but what His Words
absolutely were - I cannot remember
but I do not recollect your saying
a Word during this Interview
which I do not think contained
more than five Minutes when
His Royal Highness retired.

I have always understood the Prince
to entertain a very strong
predilection for the Marquis of
Wellesley & had any thing any
ways particular have fallen
