London, Oct 11. 1806

Sir

I have had today a long conversation with Lord Grenville on your Royal Highness's business; being enabled to speak fully upon it from having read the Princess's answer.

It now appears to me that he will adopt heartily any line which shall be recommended by the Cabinet; & what that line will be is, I think, certain. From the Discrepancies

I have had with them individually, I gather
that they only want to be satisfied the Case
made out by the Princess does not overturn the
facts avowed by Cole & Bidgood, which, apparently
will be clear to them. Then they will strenu-
ously urge the interdict from the King. I
hence trust that Your Royal Highness will
set your mind quite at ease.

The accounts from Germany are very bad.
The Prussian troops, & I suppose the King too, are

endeavouring to put the Vitala between them
& the French. The latter overran the whole
the north of Germany quite to the Swedish frontier
with petty detachments which find no oppo-
-sition.
