My Dear MacMahon. June 30th 1810

I came to Town to attend a consultation  
this morning on the Matter of Pinner's Meadow.

The difficulty raised was with regard to  
the power given to His Royal Highness, by  
the act of Parliament, to make a lease of  
99 Years and then regrant in under lease  
to the Builders - My Surrounding for such  
Re-grant that they may appropriate their  
improved ground rents.

I see no difficulty in removing this doubt  
and I have appointed another meeting here  
on Friday morning next finally to settle  
the Business - some further information  
as to the mode being necessary which can-  
not be pursued till next week.

I shall return to Town for this  
Business on Thursday - And I shall on  
Friday

Friday be prepared to lay before the  
Prince the preliminary arrangements  
and to receive His Royal Highness's  
Commands thereon.

When that is accomplished I request  
of you to say (presenting my most  
Humble Duty to the Prince) that  
unless my further services to His  
Royal Highness are required I shall  
ask Permission to go to Scotland to  
attend to some very important interests  
of my own & my family —
