Bagshot. Aug: 20th 1810.

My dear Maemahou,

I cannot express my thanks for
your kindness about the Cross. The
P. who inspected it with me in the
State yard pronounces it perfect.
We will arrange its value when I have
the pleasure of shaking ye by the
hand. The knight told me this morning
he had written a long letter to ye.
The bloody hand remains as it did.
He does not seem over anxious for it,
if he does anything to merit it, I think
it will not be difficult to procure it
him through Wellerley. I saw the
letter this morning who told me
there is no intention of bringing
forward any basket of Barbis: for

the present.

So give me a Line if ye quit
Cheltenham. I obtained leave to
quit Town sooner than I thought
& profited by it by an immediate
departure. Thank God, our Friend
was never better - certain persons
not arrived, which caused an
irritation, but which will be dispersed
towards Thursday - god bless you
