he has just received a private letter
from Mr Hole dated y^e 17th Inst^d in
which ~~Mr~~ states that he has no new
events of any importance to communicate

anxious to hear what effect the measures
taken respecting the Catholic Delegates
produces from day to day.

tranquil at Dublin, & as far as he can learn, the lower people take little or no Interest in the state of Things; and that all the well disposed approve of the course which Government has found it necessary to adopt; that he has every reason to think that all Meetings in the Country for electing Managers will be stopped by his communication to the Sheriffs and Magistrates, and that the Government shall take every care in every step that is taken, to act according to Law.
