My Dear MacMahon,

I am sure you will forgive
my trespassing on you for a moment, to
mention the anxiety I feel at hearing from
different Persons, the authenticity of whose
information I cannot doubt, that the Court
of Directors have determined on the nomi-
nation of Sir George Nugent to the Chief
Command in India, and that he has
for some days been acting on the cer-
-tainty of being confirm'd in that Appoint-
-ment - I submit to your better judgement
the propriety of making known these cir-
-cumstances to the Prime Regent - for resting
as

as I do solely, on the high and flattering
protection with which His Royal Highness
has honoured me, I shall take no indirect
measures to promote an object, which it
will be my pride to owe to His Royal High-
ness's favour alone — His Royal Highness's
condescending goodness on the present oc-
casion, can never be effaced from my
mind, and my gratitude to Him can
only cease with my life — believe me
with great regard, truly and faithfully Yours
