Hage & Jr that you should be of opinion that no Trial can be had on Col. Etherington but in the West Indies. I will state to your Majesty my opinion on this

this business, when I pay my Duty to
you.

waiting for further Leave of Absence for
Lieut Colonel Gaydickens.

I hear that the Adjutant
General continues to be in a great deal
of Danger.
