I shall not take any step towards Ld. Hertford till I have seen Ld. North on Friday; I own I agree with him in opinion that though Ld. Archibald Hamilton had no promise of the being intended for Ld. Hertford's son, yet that its being the Parish in which he lives and he had an avowed Enemy to Government he has a better right to have his Recommendation attended to than any other Person, and I should think that a very natural line for Ld. North on such Occasions to follow.

The Intelligence from France is curious, and proves that either the power of the Queen will soon be much increased or that it will be entirely annihilated.
