Lord North has the honour of
sending his Majesty several
letters which he has received from
Mr Scane, in order to be sent as
intercepted letters to America; They are
very voluminous, & Lord North has
been able to read only two of them.
When they are published in America
Mr Scane will not be able to return,
(as it appears to Lord North) without

a re-union between Great Britain &
the Colonies, & Mr Deane: seems in
that respect, to have acted fairly, &
to have put himself into ~~your~~ his
Majesty's power. But the letters
are written with so much zeal
for a reconciliation that they will,
(and North says,) have too much
the air of being written in con-
-sult with this country: as soon as
his Majesty has read what he thinks
proper of them, He will be so good as
to return them, that duplicates may

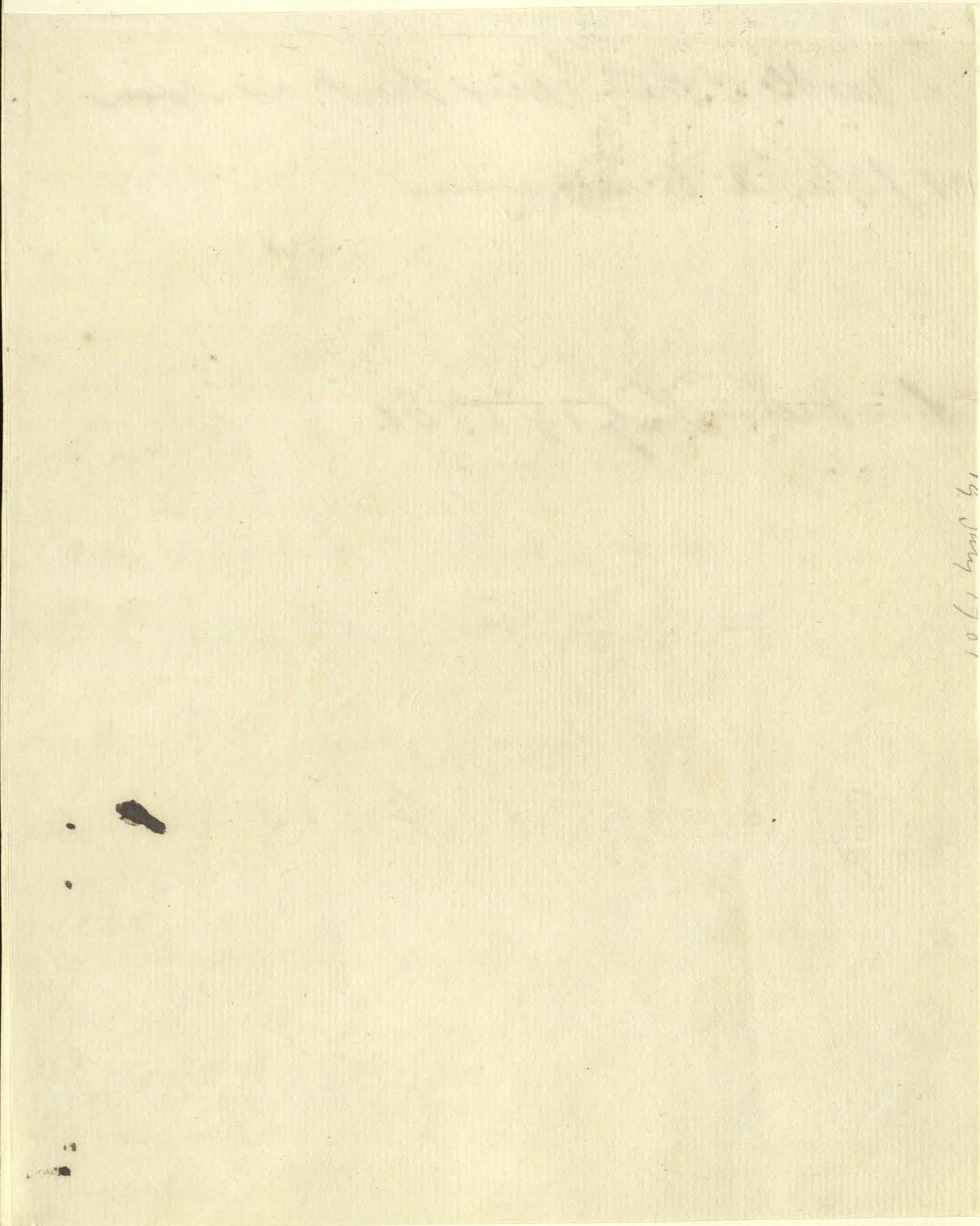
