Lord North has the honour of sending to his Majesty Lord George Gordon's letter, which he received yesterday, & submits to his Majesty, whether it will not be proper to answer it according to the inclosed. If his Majesty sees no objection to sending the inclosed answer, he will be so good as to return it to Mr Robinson, who will send it to Lord George.

Lord North having attended at the two very important Councils which were held yesterday, & finding that his presence is

~~not~~ ^{no longer} immediately necessary in Town has set
out upon his return to Oxfordshire, & shall
continue there & in the neighbourhood
for a few days with his Majesty's per-
mission. He may be brought to Town
at a day's notice at the farthest.

Lord North has the honour of
inclosing a warrant for his Majesty's
signature, if approved, & three monthly
accounts of the produce of the Civil
List Revenues.
