As by a side wind it is to be applied to the
Law which passed with regard to England,
it is a Collection of Remonstrances to the
King arraigning the act of the whole
Legislature and that too after an
actual Rebellion to force the Legislature
to repeal it.

separate Paper one that has occurred to
me.

detail my poor sentiments upon this
subject. I had not occasion to enter very
fully into them at the meeting, as the
opinion of the only two Ministers in Town
convinced so entirely with mine. a copy
of the Minute is here submitted to
Your Majesty we were all sorry to be absent
