My dear Lord

I have lately received Information that the Property of the Crown in the Lands belonging to the Government of Charlemont in this Kingdom, is in danger of being injured for want of Leases being signed by the Governor of the Fort, and there is reason to believe Inroachments have been made & other Improvements committed

Upon Enquiry I find that Lieut. General Sir Guy Carleton was appointed Governour of Charlemont on the 27th of February 1770, but that he has never applied for the Salary annexed to the office, nor appointed any Person

to pay the necessary attention to the Land
belonging to it — And as the Property of
the Crown in these Lands may suffer by
this neglect, I have thought it right to
mention the Matter in this private Manner
to your Lordship that such Steps may be
taken as may be judged proper.
